The District Committee on Nominations began our work in June of 2024 to prayerfully discern nominees for the positions set out in the *District Committee on Nominations Terms of Reference*. We met seven times over the next nine months before completing our work in March of 2025.

The committee carried out our work with a commitment to prayer and discernment, as well as a desire to populate the respective committees with godly, wise, and competent people. In addition, we were committed to constructing committees that represent the diversity of our larger family of churches. As such, special care and attention were given to geography, ethnicity, and gender in our discernment process.

As this is an election year for the District Superintendent (DS) position, the committee did their due diligence in discerning a nominee for the position while following the *Policy on Process for Electing District Superintendents* found in the *Manual of The Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada*. A call for nominations notice was posted with the district and national offices in early November 2024 indicating that Mark Peters, who is eligible to serve another term, had informed the committee of his willingness to serve another term. No nomination papers were received from any other potential candidates.

As part of the committee's discernment, we sought input from our President, Darren Herbold, and the DEXCOM Chair, Steve Schneider, regarding the incumbent DS. We are pleased to nominate Mark Peters for another term as the District Superintendent and thank him for his faithful and fruitful leadership!

Through our committee work, two things have become clear. The Lord is at work among Alliance churches in our district and He has blessed us with diverse, talented, and Spirit-filled leaders. For that, we give our thanks and praise to the Lord!


